Netanyahu Wins Likud Vote

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's **compromise proposal** won Sunday's **vote** in Likud, changing the system for how the Likud will choose its **candidates** in the next election.

The proposal says that the party's top candidates will continue to be chosen by its 100,000 **members**, but places saved for new candidates from specific areas down the list will be selected by the 3,700-member Likud central **committee**.

Among the central committee members, 2,689 voted. Netanyahu's proposal got 1,557 votes, which was 57.9 **percent**.

Likud MK (ח"כ) David Amsalem's proposal to let the central committee choose the whole Likud list received 1,040 votes, which was 38.7%.

After the final results came out, the prime minister thanked Likud central committee members, who he said

"showed **responsibility**, stood behind my proposal and voted in **favor** of the Likud and the **unity** of the party." He promised to continue to "lead the country" as a strong party, "for many years to come."

"The committee had spoken," MK Amsalem said in a **statement** after the vote, calling the night a "big win for Likud." He **praised** the "**impressive**, democratic **process**" which saw over 2,000 members show up to vote, to "decide how Likud candidates will be chosen in the next Knesset."

"As I've said from the start," he added, "the main win tonight was having a democratic process in which we all took part."

He **congratulated** Netanyahu for holding a fair and **honorable** election, and said he **accepted** the results and the voters' say. "I have no **doubt** that these **internal** elections **strengthened** the party, and I am glad to have been a part of this," his statement read.

Israeli artists sign a petition against “anti-democratic” moves by Culture Minister Regev.

More than 1,500 artists signed a [petition](#) against Culture and Sport Minister Miri Regev and her ministry [following](#) a political storm last week, in which Arab Israeli actor Norman Issa [refused](#) to take part in a [performance](#) in the Jordan Valley (בקעת הירדן).

After Issa refused to take part in a performance of the Haifa Theater’s play *Boomerang* in the Jordan Valley over the Green line, Regev called on him to [reconsider](#) his decision, and [accused](#) the actor of not believing in [coexistence](#). She followed that with a [threat](#) to cut off the ministry’s [support](#) for the theater Issa runs with his Jewish wife at the Port of Jaffa (נמל יפו), which [provides entertainment](#) for Arab and Jewish children, teens and adults.

“If Norman does not change his decision, I mean to reconsider the ministry’s support for the Elmina Theater which he [manages](#),” she said. The protesters’ petition accused Regev of [involvement](#) in “the anti-democratic moves set off by governmental [organizations](#).” The minister said those petitioning did not know her or her [policies](#). She called their petitioning action “uncultured” and “baseless.” “I don’t mean to take part in [conversations](#) through petitioning,” Regev said on Sunday, about the petition.

She [stressed](#) that “[upholding](#) the law, respect of mankind and their [liberty](#), and a love of Israel are my guiding [principles](#). I am [committed](#) to [forwarding](#) culture and [nurturing](#) creativity in the country, as well as to [promoting](#) Israeli culture abroad.” Issa, who is well known to Israelis because of his part in the Channel 2 show *Arab Labor* (עבודה ערבית), for which he [received](#) the 2012 Israel Academy Prize for Best Actor in a Comedy Show, said it was unfair to expect him to go against his own [conscience](#) and to perform in places “which are [controversial](#).”

Issa added that the matter had come up in the past. “This is not a new issue, and the problem was [solved](#) years ago, at all theaters in Israel, when it was decided that whenever a case arose in which an actor, Jewish or Arab, was refusing to appear in a specific location, for reasons of conscience, they would be replaced with another actor.”

Eran Malka convicted of bribery

Former Police Ch.-Insp. Eran Malka was convicted of bribery and other charges by the Jerusalem District Court, as part of a plea bargain in which he turned state's witness against an even higher police commander, former Asst.-Ch. Bruno Stein. Malka, who may serve years in prison since his deal reportedly only protects his family's money and pension benefits, was charged on May 14, along with former head Tel Aviv State Prosecutor Ruth David; lawyer Ronel Fisher; businessman Yair Biton; and a few others in one of the country's wildest bribery systems ever known.

He was convicted of passing information on to David and Fisher in return for bribes, to help them outsmart the police as suspects represented by David and Fisher were questioned. Stein, who was reported last week to be the latest suspect in the scandal, was questioned by the police. The questioning was reportedly about the allegations by Malka that Stein was flown to Budapest by Biton, given limo rides, and promised a well paid job in one of the businessman's companies when he leaves the police.

New charges also came out last Wednesday, with the statement saying it likely would charge former Ashdod Port Chairman Alon Hassan and a number of other port managers and workers on a wide collection of bribery, fraud and blackmail charges. Hassan was the first player who revealed Fisher's illegal actions, which later grew into the scandal that we know about today.

Rainbows in Tel Aviv

The White City filled with all the colors of the rainbow on Friday, as tens of thousands took to Tel Aviv's central streets for the 17th Gay Pride Parade.

The festivities began Friday morning with a party at the Meir Park, where the Tel Aviv lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender center is set, and kicked off around noon with a record-breaking 180,000 participants parading in support of the LGBT community. MK's from the right-wing Likud and left-wing Meretz parties were also seen with large flags. About 30,000 tourists coming from countries such as Brazil, Austria, Belgium, Spain, Sweden, the US and the UK took part in the largest gay pride event in Asia, and one of the only gay parades in the Middle East.

Road crossings lines were painted in bright rainbow colors, pride flags hung at nearly every other store-front, and out of many windows.

The march was led by a series of floats making their way slowly south on Hayarkon Street, along the beaches where thousands were waiting to cool off.

Highlighting this year's pride theme was the slogan, "Tel Aviv Loves All Genders."

While transgender and transsexual people still seemed to be a minority at the parade, the event's focus on that community was clearly respected.

The focus on transgenderism was an attracting factor for the starring performance by Austria's bearded diva Conchita Wurst, at the huge beach party where the march finished, at the seafront Charles Clore Park.

The program also included a special performance by Israel's Eurovision Golden Boy contestant, Nadav Guedj.

Orange CEO visits Israel

Less than two weeks after saying in Cairo that Orange S.A. would shortly cut its [licensing](#) deal with Israel's Partner [Communications](#) if it were not financially too expensive to do so, the company's CEO (מנכ"ל) came to Jerusalem on Friday, [apologized](#) again for his [comments](#), and said his company wants to keep [investing](#) here.

Stephane Richard, who set off a storm of [criticism](#) with the comments he later said were taken the wrong way, said at the start of his Friday meeting with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu that Orange is in the business of communication and connecting people, "surely not to [participate](#) in any kind of [boycott](#)."

Richard said he deeply [regrets](#) the storm over his words and wants "to make totally clear that Orange as a company has never [supported](#) and will never support any kind of boycott against Israel."

Richard came to Israel for a short visit, after his call to apologize in Paris to Israel's [ambassador](#) was turned down, and he was told that if he wanted to make things clear, he would have to do so in Jerusalem.

"It's no secret that the comments you made last week were widely seen as an attack on Israel, and so your visit here is a chance to set things straight," Netanyahu said at the start of the meeting.

Following his meeting with Netanyahu, Richard met with [former](#) President Shimon Peres, who said his visit was "very important" because Orange's [opposition](#) to boycotts and support for Israel needed to be heard "in a clear voice."

Actor Christopher Lee dies at age 93

British actor Christopher Lee, who played Dracula in [horror](#) classics but became known to later [generations](#) for roles in *Star Wars* and as the [wizard](#) Saruman in the *Lord of the Rings*, has died at age 93.

Lee died last week in a London hospital, where he had been getting [treatment](#) for [respiratory](#) problems.

The London born actor became famous in the late 1950s into the 1970s, playing [characters including](#) Dracula, Frankenstein's monster and the [Mummy](#) for *Hammer Films*. Later in his career, he had unforgettable roles in a series of [blockbuster](#) movies. With his deep voice and tall (1.93-metre) stance, Lee was the last English-language horror movie star, in a line that goes back to silent movie celebrity Lon Chaney, and included Bela Lugosi, Boris Karloff, Vincent Price and Peter Cushing, Lee's regular Hammer Films co-star.

Christopher Frank Carandini Lee was born on May 27, 1922, and took up acting after serving in Britain's Royal Air Force in World War II.

British Prime Minister David Cameron called the actor, "a titan of (the) golden age of cinema." London [Mayor](#) Boris Johnson called Lee, "one of the greatest British actors and a master of the macabre."

[Director](#) Tim Burton, who worked with Lee on five movies, called him, "the last of his kind" and "a true [legend](#)."

Everything under Five

Cofix opens a new supermarket chain.

Just 18 months after Cofix came onto the coffee market with its NIS5 coffee and **snacks** – a formula that led to a **record growth** to 75 **branches** – the company opened the doors to its newest price-cutting business this month: Super Cofix.

Like the coffee shop, Super Cofix **grocery** store, set in Tel Aviv's Florentin **neighborhood**, sells **products** for a maximum of NIS5, and everything else for a fraction (colored labels mark items that can be bought at higher **amounts**, up to five items for NIS5). More than the simple price difference, Super Cofix is taking a **gamble** that buyers want to shop differently. “Super Cofix is re-writing the concept of discount **packaging**,” **Founder** Avi Katz told *The Jerusalem Post*. “Until today, what did we think? Buy a lot, throw away half, put some in **storage** and you'll get it cheap. Discount pricing means ‘buy the right amount at the right price.’” Discount **competitor** Rami Levy sells large amounts at lower prices, focusing on large families with cars, who can drive to their out-of-town stores. Cofix, in **contrast**, is taking the chance that city people believe good things come in small packages.

Cofix's Gil Unger **estimated** that the **average** Israeli family throws away NIS360 **worth** of food each month.

To **convince suppliers** to sell the company either discounted goods or create smaller units to sell, Cofix put three rules into place: First, one price point means there is no **flexibility** in dealing with suppliers. The second is to offer only one **brand** for each product, meaning that whichever company agrees to supply the store with, say, cottage cheese, would get the money of all the cottage cheese sales from the 100 branches Super Cofix plans to open in the coming years. The third is that Cofix is not trying to “have it all” in terms of what is offers, though the 700 products serve most of buyers' needs.

The strategy seems to be working. A checkup which **compares** some of the Super Cofix prices to that of a Mega supermarket in central Tel Aviv found that Cofix had the price **advantage**. When **adjusting** for sizes, cheese was about a third cheaper, turkey cold cuts (חזה הודו) half the price.

Of the products surveyed by the *Post*, only **diapers** were more expensive at Cofix.

The focus on smaller, more useful amounts “is a change all over the world, not only in Israel,” said Unger. Unger, who is on the **board**, said the company is trying to take 1% of the country's NIS70 billion food market within five years.

Bad **performance** at Mega especially, has raised **rumors** that the company could close or be bought out.

“I'm afraid that, yes, one of the chains will not be here next year,” Unger said.

Already the opening has had an effect on the market: Victory, a competitor, said it would lower its prices to compete.

Asked whether he sees a price war as a **threat**, Katz answered, “A threat? I won! I can close my doors and go home. Yesterday he sold it for [NIS] 6, today he sells it for [NIS] 4.90; from a Zionist perspective... I've already won. If that's not winning, what is winning?” Cofix is raising money for its fast growth, which already **includes** three Super Cofix branches in Petah Tikva, Herzliya, and Tel Aviv's Yigal Alon Street.

ISRAEL USED VIRUS TO SPY ON IRAN NUCLEAR TALKS

”

A cyber-security company has found **breaches** in its **software** at three Swiss hotels, by a virus, which is believed to have been created by Israeli **intelligence**. The three hotels held the Iran **nuclear** talks.

Kaspersky **Lab** ZAO found the virus at the three hotels, where world powers and Iran held talks over its nuclear program in the past year, the *Wall Street Journal* reported last Wednesday. **According** to its report of the **investigation**, Kaspersky cross-checked thousands of hotels in search of such breaches, and found only three. The company did not name the hotels, but the talks have been held in just six hotels in Switzerland and Austria since the diplomatic **effort** first began.

Kaspersky has **concluded** that the cause for the breaches was a **sophisticated** virus known as Duqu, which let its **handlers** follow **activity**, steal computer files and listen in on the rooms in which computers are working.

The company also reported that the front desks of the hotels had also been **hacked**, which the *Journal* said helped the hackers **identify** the room numbers of specific **delegates** and ministers. US **officials** **accused** Israel of **spying** on the talks back in 2014, and have **repeated** those accusations a few times since. Israel's intelligence effort, they say, began in 2012, when the Obama rule first opened a secret channel with Tehran.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said last week that he is very **disappointed** that Israel had no part in the talks, given the **impact** a deal would have on the Jewish state.

“No one from this area, except Iran, is at the **negotiating** table,” Netanyahu said. “Somebody once said: ‘If you’re not at the table, you’re on the menu.’ The states with the most at risk are not even in the room.”

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The Hazan Case

An embarrassing headache for Likud that Netanyahu didn't need.

The timing of the MK Oren Hazan (Likud) scandal could not be worse for Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

It happened less than a week before last Sunday's important Likud central [committee vote](#). The vote was on whether to give itself the power to choose the party's lists for future Knessets, or to keep the open primary system, which Netanyahu [supports](#). Channel 2 reported that Likud's 30th MK (ח"כ) – who was [elected](#) in a primary – [allegedly pimped](#) out [prostitutes](#) and [provided](#) the drug crystal meth to [gamblers](#) at a casino he ran in Bulgaria.

[Senior](#) Likud [members](#) say the Prime Minister was caught completely by surprise when the reports came out.

Six months ago, Hazan [burst](#) onto the political scene in his Likud primary run for the young adult spot, No. 30. He filmed a mafia-style campaign video, in which his father, [former](#) MK Yehiel Hazan, who was caught voting twice on a [bill](#), spoke in a Marlon Brando-esque voice, breathing heavily, and told him to clear the family name. Netanyahu quietly backed Hazan, because for the Likud leader, the alternative was much worse. Hazan was up against Shai Malka, assistant to then-MK Moshe Feiglin. Netanyahu has always wanted to freeze out Feiglin's group in the Likud, Manhigut Yehudit. When the Likud won the election by such big numbers, the surprise - 30th Likud MK quickly caught the media's interest.

It became clear that Hazan was the closest thing to a [frat](#) boy the Knesset had ever seen. He ran a casino in Bulgaria, where gambling is legal, and a bar in Tel Aviv, and had plenty of Facebook photos of himself partying.

Hazan started his work with the feeling of a mini-celebrity. He [denied](#) running a casino, but in the end said that he's young, he likes to have a good time, and that is nothing to be [ashamed](#) of. When the time came for jobs to be handed out, somehow Hazan came out with membership in five different Knesset committees, among them are Foreign Affairs and Defense (חוג ובטחון), as well as Finance, and the [Deputy](#) Knesset speaker position.

Hazan wore his new jobs with pride, and did not listen to more senior Likud politicians' [advice](#) to lower his profile so people would take him seriously.

Last Monday night, Hazan went from the mostly [harmless](#) class [clown](#) and fun selfie partner of the 20th Knesset, to [suspected](#) pimp and crystal meth user, a persona-non-grata to the point that his own party was trying to find ways to get him out of the Knesset. Hazan denied the allegations, but his following [threats](#) to Knesset Speaker Yuli Edelstein that he'll look up stories about him and take them to the media did not seem to help Hazan's case.

While Hazan could be put on trial for crimes in Bulgaria, the [process](#) is not simple, and the chances it will happen seem low.

Even the Knesset Ethics Committee will have trouble finding a get-out to [allow](#) it to [punish](#) an MK for things he did before being elected.

All this is a [headache](#) that Netanyahu didn't need while he works to [convince](#) the central committee to keep the primaries open, because the prime minister thinks changing the system will lose the Likud votes in the next election.

Maybe, [instead](#) of changing the way the list is chosen, Netanyahu and the Likud should work on a better selection system, and [avoid](#) more headaches in the future.

A Writer's Spirit

An interview with Galila Ron-Feder-Amit.

Galila Ron-Feder-Amit may not be sixteen anymore, but she surely keeps in touch with the younger [generation](#) – and [manages](#) to keep her youthful spirit alive and kicking. I caught up with the productive 65-year-old, Haifa-born, [veteran](#) Jerusalemite children's [author](#), and TV and film [screenwriter](#).

She is known for her amazing number of children's books – so far, she has written around 400 books, which have been [translated](#) into ten languages, [including](#) English and Chinese – but she started out with a more adult [audience](#) in mind.

"I grew up in a [left-wing] Mapai household and [environment](#), and I didn't know anything about the Irgun or Jabotinsky.

When I read stuff about what went on between the Hagana and Irgun, I felt really bad," she explains. After the then-16-year-old Ron-Feder-Amit got some of her sadness and [frustration](#) out of her system, by crying over the fact that two Jewish groups could be such [enemies](#), she soon got down to writing a book based on the Irgun. Mind you, this was after already writing many other stories, which she hid away in her bedroom. "My parents knew I wrote stories, but in those days, it wasn't the kind of thing you shared with your friends and classmates," she remembers. "Back then, you were [supposed](#) to be outside, [climbing](#) trees and that sort of thing. If you spent your time writing, it was as if you didn't have a real life in the real world."

Ron-Feder-Amit's [attempt](#) to right the wrong she felt had been done to the right-wing pre-state group became a whole book, but she didn't know if it was any good. The youngster clearly had a strong [will](#), and she went right to the [source](#).

"I sent the book to Menachem Begin," she remembers.

Begin was then a minister in the National Unity (אִיחוד לאומי) Government and, of course, would later become prime minister. He contacted the teenager's parents, inviting her over to his home to talk about her work.

"That changed my life and my [eventual](#) career," says the writer. "He told me that I should write children's books, because children have an open heart. He said that if I wanted to write for the heart, I should write for children, because adults are too rational."

When she is not spinning out another book, the writer spends much of her time traveling around the country to talk to schoolchildren of all ages. Not only an enjoyable [experience](#), it is a good way of keeping an eye on her readers, and keeping in touch with what the kids of today are into. "I am very interested in what the kids say and think, and in the questions they bring up. What I wrote 20 or 30 years ago is different from what I write about today. Children today have all sorts of interests that weren't around when I was younger, and that's fine."

Ron-Feder-Amit has said she doesn't know exactly how many books she has written so far, but it is around 400. That is a quite massive body of work – which surely must take a lot of time and energy. "Yes, I do get a bit tired from writing so much," she says, "but I take breaks when I write for television or for the cinema. Writing [scripts](#) is very different, and I find that [refreshing](#)." A new series based on her books called *להתבגר* started a run on Channel 10 last month.

She also takes complete breaks from her creative actions. "I go abroad a couple of times a year, to the Far East and other places. I've visited India nine times, and I never wrote a word there, but I find India very [inspiring](#)."

Does she take a laptop with her? "No computer, and I don't even take a notebook with me; I don't need to write things down. If I come across something interesting or inspiring, I remember it, and get it down when I get back home."

While many of her books are about kids enjoying kids' [adventures](#), there is also a strong [educational](#) side to her work, and she has often dealt with painful [subjects](#). One book in her *Time Tunnel* (*מנהרת הזמן*)

series, for example, was based on the 1974 Palestinian terrorist attack on a school in Ma'alot. That subject matter calls for a **steady** and **sensitive** hand. "I have written about the Holocaust, too," notes Ron-Feder-Amit. "That needs even more tact and **delicacy**," she said.

So, how does she go about passing on such **horrors** to young children? For that, the author was able to call on some **professional experience**. "I was part of the management of Yad Vashem for many years, and I understood that not letting children under the age of ten visit the new museum was a smart move. Small children cannot deal with or take in such things."

In addition to meeting schoolchildren on a regular basis, Ron-Feder-Amit has had much first-hand experience with young **members** of society. At the age of 24, as a newlywed and before she had any children of her own, she contacted the **welfare authorities** and asked how she could become a **foster** mother.

Over the next few months, she and her first husband took in ten children between the ages of three and nine, caring for them for a number of years. Naturally, the flow of children and the family dynamics gave the writer plenty of ideas for her books. Her first child – she has three of her own – was born into the already large family **nest**.

Ron-Feder-Amit has come a long way since her first attempts at writing **worthy literary** works.

Thankfully, she no longer has to keep her writing secret.

Sometimes it feels like there's nothing better in the world than a good brunch. As we are taught, breakfast is the most important meal of the day; but, it can also be the best one, when you **treat** yourself a bit. If you're looking for the right place for a **luxurious** breakfast **experience**, look no **further** than the water. The Yam Breakfast at The Dan Hotel, that is. **Conveniently located** at Hayarkon 99, you can easily get to the spot with a beautiful walk along the *tayelet*. As bright and colorful as the building is on the outside (that **rainbow** face you always see from the beach), it is amazing and elegant on the inside. Even if you are just at the hotel for breakfast, you will feel like you are on vacation. And that's before you even taste the food.

Do you ever find yourself **torn**, having to choose between the huge **spread** of a buffet breakfast, and ordering a perfect dish from a menu? This is a dilemma I sometimes find myself facing at hotel breakfasts. But, at The Dan, you get the best of both worlds. The price of breakfast **includes** both the buffet, and the "a la carte" menu - can you say, 'have your cake and eat it, too?' The menu includes the brunch classics we all **crave**, like Salmon Eggs Benedict, Shakshuka, Omelets, and French Toast, and of course, all the **delicious** coffee drinks and fresh juice that you could want. And the buffet on the other hand has, well, anything else you might be craving. Fresh salad, a beautiful bread selection, pancakes, **pastries** - you'll have a hard time **deciding** how to fill your plate. Thankfully, you can always go back for more! There was even a burekka station, with different kinds of burekkas, and a person whose job was to prepare it for you, with a brown egg and **sauce**. My favorite item from the buffet was the marinated salmon. It was so fresh and delicious, oily and **flavorful** in just the right way. There is a lot of salmon served at brunches in Tel Aviv, but **rarely** do you taste one as delicious as this. I also loved the olive tapenade, or should I say tapenades, because there was both black and green. When you love olives as much as I do, a good tapenade is such a treat. And if you really wanted to go olive crazy, there was also yummy olive bread. This also went perfectly

with the basil (בזיליקום - ריחן) and mozzarella of the caprese salad, and some fresh olive oil and balsamic **vinegar**. The only thing

that was missing from the buffet, **according** to my dining partner, was a potato dish. I personally didn't miss having it, with all the other yummy options, but I agree that it would be a nice **addition**. The food overall was of very high **quality** and prepared well. And, let's be **honest**, there's nothing better than having a delicious meal while looking out the large windows at the blue waves of the Mediterranean (הים). Who doesn't love to **sip** coffee while enjoying Tel Aviv's most beautiful view? I can't think of a more perfect way to start the weekend!

Big in Japan

Travel tips for the amazing Tokyo.

Tokyo is a place of clubs, [temples](#), smoky restaurants, and karaoke pubs whose music you can hear in the streets.

[Tradition](#) can be hard to find in the streets and towers of the huge city of 13 million. It is the place for the head offices of companies such as Sony, and [host](#) of the 2020 Summer Olympics, mainly because of its name as a clean place that gets things done. But with a little time and walking, you can get to backstreets where blocks of tofu sit in [buckets](#) of water, tatami [mat](#)-makers sell their goods, and people line up in front of ramen shops waiting to eat noodles from [steaming bowls](#).

Here are tips for getting the most out of a trip to Tokyo:

The Sumida River, a major [artery](#) in Edo, Tokyo's old name, often [appears](#) in art, like wood-block prints. View such prints at the Ota [Memorial](#) Museum.

The river is less lovely today, but a [ferry](#) ride from Hinode [Pier](#) up to Asakusa is still fun. The boat goes under different bridges past [landmarks](#) such as Tsukuda, known for many years as the home of "tsukudani", a dish of meat, seafood or seaweed (אצות) cooked in soy sauce, then served on steaming white rice.

Not far away is Tsukiji, a chaotic fish market said to be the world's largest. The best hour to come here is around [dawn](#). To see the tuna [auctions](#), people must [apply](#) on a first-come, first-served basis from 4.30 a.m., at the information center at the Kachidoki entry to the market. One group of 60 is let in between 5.25 a.m. and 5.50 a.m., and another from 5.50 a.m. to 6.15 a.m. Further upriver is the Kokugikan, where Grand Sumo [tournaments](#) are held three times a year, in January, May and September.

The two-week-long tournaments start early in the morning, and have massive, almost naked [wrestlers](#) fighting on a high sand [ring](#).

From the boat at Asakusa, with the river at your back, walk ten minutes to Sensoji, the Asakusa Kannon Buddhist temple. Enter through the Kaminarimon, a bright red gate with a huge hanging [lantern](#), and head up the Nakamise shopping street.

The Asakusa area still has an old [neighborhood](#) vibe. About a five minute walk from the temple is a street of restaurants, selling grilled meat on [skewers](#) and cooked tofu. Sit on a bar stool for some beer or hot sake.

No visit to Tokyo would be complete without sushi, and Tsukiji is the place to go. Walk through the [narrow](#) streets around the market, and join the lines outside shops for some of the freshest fish around. Other shops offer meals of cooked or grilled fish, soup and rice.

Visit Sukiyabashi Jiro, a very small basement sushi restaurant run by an 80 year old chef that hosted US. President Barack Obama when he visited Japan in April. [Reservations](#) at this three-Michelin-star restaurant must be made well ahead of time.

If you feel [daring](#) enough, try the fugu, a [poisonous](#) blow-fish ('אבו נפהא') that can be deadly if not made the right way. Torafugu Tei Monzen Naka-cho offers fair priced meals, that [include](#) thin pieces of uncooked fugu across a plate, and fried, crispy pieces of the fish, finishing with a thick rice porridge (דייסה). To drink, there is hot sake [flavored](#) with a toasted fugu [fin](#).

We all want a GoPro action camera. We don't know **exactly** why, but every shot with it looks like it was planned by Steven Spielberg himself.

We can now agree that GoPro is the most famous action camera on Earth, and the name GoPro has become a **synonym** for action cameras. However, there are other action cameras on sale, and the good people at *Techradar* have checked them out for us. Here is a **roundup** of what they know about action cameras. All cameras in this **article** have at least HD 1080 **abilities**, some have 4K, so no need to worry about **quality**:

Garmin VIRB Elite.

Garmin is famous for its **navigational** and GPS **products**. Garmin has also entered the action video world with some camera models. The VIRB Elite records your action and your **location** at the same time. It can record up to three hours at 1080p. It has one large **sliding** switch to turn recording on and off quickly and easily. It **fits** on all GoPro **accessories**, so no need for extra **expenses**. Prices start at US\$210.

Drift Ghost-S

This action camera was designed to **withstand** anything, and it looks like it too. It does not have GPS or 4K **capabilities**, but if you fall and break all your bones, you can be sure that the Drift Ghost-S caught it all on3 camera. It does have WiFi, so you can send your **injury** videos out **instantly**. Price is around US\$295.

Sony AZ1 VR

Sony thinks differently. So the LED screen which most cameras have on the camera itself is useless when it is **mounted** on your **helmet** for example. Sony took the screen off the camera, and gave the user a **wrist** live screen, so you can be your own **director** during filming. With this camera, you can also use slow motion filming at 120 fps, which is great for making a jump look **professional**. Prices around US\$350.

iON Air Pro 3

Simple design and easy **operation** make this action camera very popular. It **vibrates** to let you know when it starts and stops recording. That is helpful when the camera is out of **sight**, and on your helmet. Is also has WiFi capabilities. Prices around US\$270.

Muvi K-Series K2NPNG

The name doesn't really help. The plus about getting this camera is the package; when you buy a Muvi camera, you get almost all the mounts and accessories with it. Prices around US\$260.

Panasonic HX-500E

Panasonic think they are better than others. The camera they have designed is made up of two parts, with a cable connecting them. The **lens** housing is small, and fits almost anywhere. The "brain" housing, which **includes** the screen and other functions, can be kept in your backpack or **tied** to your bike. I don't like it, but others may. This camera has NFC as well as WiFi. Prices around US\$300.

Buffet meal: you're doing it wrong.

The buffet meal scene can sometime look like the fight on the Bastille. Somehow, regular, practical people fear that the food will be taken away before they get some, or that others will take all of the choice items, leaving them to **munch** on **radishes**.

This **irrational approach** usually ends in two major buffet mistakes: going to the table too quickly, and putting too much food on your **plate**. Here's how to do it right:

Approach

Never go for the food before the buffet is **officially** open. Just because cold plates are there before the hot dishes are set out does not signal a call to action, and it creates uncalled for **stress** for the serving **staff**.

Before **piling** food on your plate, look at the dining tables. Gender and status privileges have no place in the buffet line. Don't try to get ahead of anyone, and don't break up a couple or a group going through the line together.

Dishing

If one item is in short **supply**, go easy on it. At a restaurant or hotel, it is fine to ask to have a dish re-filled. At a private party, don't ask.

Use the serving **spoon** or **fork** given for a specific dish, and put the serving piece next to the plate when you are finished. A hot metal spoon in a dish could burn the fingers of another diner. Never overload your dish. Going back for seconds or thirds is perfectly **acceptable**.

Serving Stations

When different dishes are served at serving stations, as at a brunch buffet, remember that the serving staff is **limited** in what they can **provide**. Special **requests** are okay, as long as they are easily **accomplished**. And only ask for extra **ingredients** that are in sight and readily **available**.

Plates

In a restaurant, plenty of clean, freshly-polished plates should be available, which means you should not have to re-use a plate. When you're going back to the buffet for seconds, don't **hesitate** to ask a server to replace a plate or **silverware**, or take what you need at the buffet table. In a private home, use your sense to understand whether you should keep your plate or ask for a new one.

Sitting Down

If people invite you to join their table as you leave the buffet line, either accept **politely**, or find a way to **refuse** just as kindly.

Even though people at your table will be sitting down to eat at different times, it's still a good idea to be nice to the others at the table, while **engaging** them in **conversation**. If you need to leave the table for a while, be sure to place your **napkin** on the **seat** or arm of your chair. Napkins should not go back on the table until you are leaving for good.

Standing Up

If you're eating while standing up, at a stand-up buffet or a cocktail party, it's even more important not to overload your plate. That way you can mingle a bit. Keep your food in your left hand, so that your right is available for **handshakes**.

You put yourself at a great **disadvantage** if both hands are busy with food and drink.

When you **decide** on a place to stand, make sure you are not blocking the door or a way to the buffet table. But remember that social meals are hardly ever about the food itself, so mix and mingle.

New on the Shelves

The latest reads worth checking out this week.

What Should a Person be Like? by Sheila Heti, Kinneret, Zmora-Bitan –

I've always thought that our '20s are a terrible time in our lives. So many big **decisions**, so many changes and so little self-knowledge make these years very hard, and sometimes even **depressing** and **anxiety**-causing. Heti's novel, if you can call it that, is exactly about that. The writer herself is its main **character**. She is trying to find a **direction**, make friendships last for the first time of her life, she loses herself in an **abusive** relationship with an **unpleasant** man, **discovers** more about her sexuality and **creativity**, etc. Above all stands the question of the title – 'What should a person be like?' How should we **behave**? How do you choose what's right for you? How do you deal with other people? How do you keep true to yourself, and who are you, anyway? Not easy questions to answer. This is quite a **brilliant** book, which will sometimes try your **patience**, but stick to it for a **satisfying**, **original** and intelligent reading **experience**.



The Girl on the Train by Paula Hawkins, Keter –

This **thriller** was one of the biggest **literary** sensations of the past year, and is still on the New York Times' bestseller list. And I can see why – it has great twists, and **engaging** characters and **plot**. It starts with Rachel travelling on the train to London and back every day. On her way, she watches the buildings pass by. In one of them lives a nice-looking couple, whom Rachel gets to see almost daily. She starts making up names for these people, and builds a whole **imaginary** life story for them. Then, the woman **disappears**. Rachel believes some sort of crime has been **committed**, but has no idea what it is, or by whom. Also, who would believe her – a woman who we soon learn is an alcoholic, has major holes in her memory, and other problems in her life? Rachel is totally obsessed, and so begins looking deeper and deeper into what happened. But is what she believes happened true, or is it all in her **unstable** mind? The **suspense** won't leave you for a minute.



Max by Ronaldo Wrobel, Yediot Sfarim –

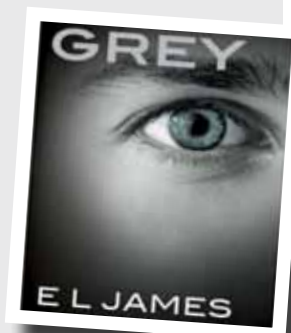
In 1936, Max – a shoe maker living in Brazil – is called to the Rio police station. As a Jewish **immigrant**, he is filled with fear, since many other immigrants have already been sent to prison for no reason, or even **deported** out of the country. But this is not why he is there. The officer in charge, Avelar, asks him to read a note written in Yiddish. When he **manages** to do so, the officer asks that he become one of the country's censors, reading letters to and from Jews living in the country. This is how he first gets to know Hannah, a Jewish woman writing to her sister, and falls in love with her. He wants to marry her, but when he finds out who she really is, things become much more **complicated**. It is not every day that we get to read a book by a Jewish-Brazilian writer, telling us about the life of the Jewish **community** in Brazil, and since it is also a wonderful, moving story well-written, it is a read that you just can't **allow** yourselves to miss.

My Dad is the Boss

How to succeed in a family business.

There is one big **advantage** 23-year-old Clint Morrison found in joining his family's business right after he finished university: he has a job, while most of his friends do not. "They're all still sort of looking," Morrison says. The Morrison family business, Benefit Design Specialists Inc., makes **employee benefit** plans for small businesses, and is based in Pennsylvania. Father Tim employs not only his youngest son, Clint, but also two older sons, ages 27 and 29, as well as his own sister, a sister-in-law, a **cousin** and about ten other employees that are not part of the family. The key to a peaceful office with so many family **members**? "You have to find a place for them to be productive, or they won't make it in the family business," the father says. Here are some tips on joining the workforce - with your **relatives**, **according** to family business **experts**:

Start somewhere else

One of Clint Morrison's business professors **recommended** him not to start in the family business. The **advice**: go somewhere else and get some information and **experience** in the field first. Because of the state of the job market and his family's specialty niche, Morrison **decided** that it was not an option. The strategy worked well for Laura Salpeter, who got a law **degree**, and then worked for a few years at a law office before joining her father Scott Salpeter's Miami-based **investment** banking company, Cassel Salpeter. Also working there, after a few years of getting experience with other companies, is Philip Cassel, son of Scott Salpeter's partner. Both children are now 30.

Work your way up

Even if you spent your childhood playing in the family **factory**, that does not mean you are going to just walk into a corner office your first day. Robert Spielman, a partner in the **tax** and business services unit at Marcum LLP, tells clients that it is their job to make sure their kids are **exposed** to all parts of the business, especially if they want to hand it over to them one day. The best way is to start at the **bottom**, and experience all areas of the business. If the family business is a **trucking** company, start out in **maintenance**, then drive for six months, go into sales and then help on the financing side, before **managing** the trucks and employees, Spielman says.

Manage expectations

The family business dream - that someday, all of this will be yours - can be a great **motivator**, but it can also give a bad sense of privilege. This happened to one family business **owner** client of Steve Faulkner, head of J.P. Morgan Private Bank's Advice Lab. The son was holding his status over his co-workers and managers, saying "Someday, I'm going to own all of this, and **fire** everyone I don't like." When the son's manager had enough **courage** to tell the boss, he fired his own son. However, two months later, when the son could not find another job, the boss asked another manager to take him back. "That's a bad plan," said Faulkner. It is better, he says, for business owners to get their relatives to work harder than they ever have, to be **worthy** to take over. The **process** **drills** respect into the employees, something Laura Salpeter says she has learned on the job. Her top advice for those joining the family business? Understand you are working for your parent, not with your parent.

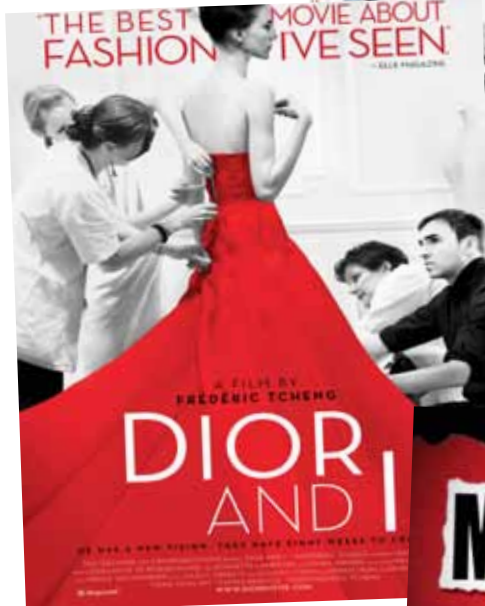

The Best of Douglas

The famous actor honored at the Jerusalem Cinematheque.

Michael Douglas will get the Genesis Prize for his humanitarian work on June 18 from Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at a [ceremony](#) at the Jerusalem Theater, and will give an interview at the Jerusalem Cinematheque during the day.

Douglas' fans will be happy to know that in honor of his visit, the Jerusalem Cinematheque is holding a retrospective of some of the highlights of his career.

Douglas succeeded in coming out from under the [shadow](#) of his famous father, Kirk Douglas, to create his own [identity](#) as an actor. Douglas is known among A-list stars for his [willingness](#) to play [characters](#) that are not very likable, even downright [evil](#).

But as [tough](#) and evil as the characters he plays may sometimes be, Douglas has a [charm](#) that can make you [identify](#) with them. Here are some of his most remembered roles:

His most famous role was in Oliver Stone's *Wall Street*, for which he won a Best Actor Oscar in 1988.

His "[greed](#) is good" speech in that film was one of the most [controversial](#) movie moments of the 1980s, and has become a famous saying.

You might not think of Douglas as a romantic comedy guy, but he did play a romantic lead in Rob Reiner's *The American President*. The movie, in which Douglas plays a US president who romances a lobbyist played by Annette Bening, was written by Aaron Sorkin, and was kind of a tryout for the television series Sorkin later created, *The West Wing*.

Steven Soderbergh's *Traffic* (2000), is a multi-character look at how drugs [affect](#) life in the US. Douglas gives one of his most [complex performances](#) as a hard working but [arrogant](#) politician given the [impossible](#) job of being the (anti) drug czar, who cannot stop his daughter from falling into drug [addiction](#). His real-life wife Catherine Zeta-Jones plays the wife of a jailed drug dealer in another of the movie's storylines.

Paul Verhoeven's *Basic Instinct* is the kind of fun trash they don't seem to be able to do much anymore. Sharon Stone stole the show when she crossed her legs, but Douglas is as [convincing](#) as anyone could be in the role of the police [detective](#) in love with this femme fatale.

The China Syndrome, was a very relevant film that dealt with the issue of [nuclear](#) power in the US. Douglas plays a news cameraman who is working with a reporter played by Jane Fonda, to get the truth out about an accident at a nuclear site.

The movie came out just 12 days before the Three-Mile Island nuclear accident in the US.

Douglas [produced](#) this movie and was [passionate](#) about this goal.

Douglas' first outing as a producer was Milos Forman's *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*, [considered](#) to be one of the greatest films of the seventies, if not of all time. After almost 40 years, the movie, based on the Ken Kesey novel, is as [gripping](#), dark, funny and moving as it was the day it was first screened.

Among the other films that were shown as part of this [tribute](#) will be *King of California* and *The Game*.

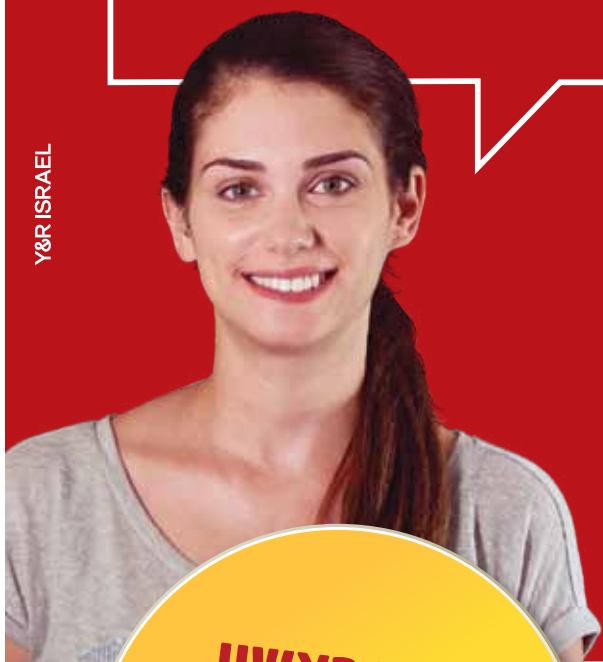

A Time for Truth

An interesting look at post-war Germany with 'Labyrinth of Lies.'

"One woman in Germany who saw the film told me afterwards, 'There is a box from our grandfather, it's locked with a key, and we didn't want to open it, we didn't want to know what he did during the war,'" said Giulio Ricciarelli, the **director** of *Labyrinth of Lies*, an award-winning drama based on the **trials** of the commanders of Auschwitz in Germany in the mid-Sixties.

Ricciarelli, along with the movie's star, Alexander Fehling, spoke at a **press conference** at the Tel Aviv Cinematheque earlier this month. "In school, you visit the **concentration** camps, you learn the history, but in families, there are still a lot of secrets," said Ricciarelli, whose parents are Italian, but who grew up in Germany.

For Ricciarelli, *Labyrinth of Lies*, a fact-based drama about a trial that has been all but forgotten, is a way to get Germans to open those boxes in their **attics**.

In one of the movie's most moving moments, the young **prosecutor** is **confronted** by a man who asks him, "Do you want every young person to ask if his father is a murderer?" The prosecutor's answer, and the movie's, is a loud 'yes.'

Alexander Fehling **echoed** the feelings of many viewers when he said, "The story behind the movie surprised me. I thought Germany confronted itself years ago, right after the war, and dealt with history... I didn't know that it took so long to start this [judicial] **process**."

Fehling plays a young prosecutor, who was chosen by Fritz Bauer, an **attorney general** for one area of Germany, to prosecute the men who ran Auschwitz. While soon after the war Germany **admitted** to the murder of millions of Jews and others in the death camps and began paying **compensations** to **survivors**, many, if not most, of those **responsible** for the Holocaust went back to living their lives with no legal **consequences**.

Ricciarelli, an actor, had made some short films, but when he heard about this story, he knew that he had found the **subject** for his first long film.

"There was something that happened when [co-writer Elisabeth Bartel and I] wrote the **script**. At first, I was like a child, you know, 'Let's write a movie!' But then, because of the subject and the **horror** of it, we had to push ourselves, our egos back. It was always about the story. The process for me was very **fulfilling**. It was such a big mission."

The movie, which has been shown all over Europe, has won a number of **awards**, and is up for a few Lola Awards, the prize of the German film **industry**, which will be given out in a **ceremony** this month.

Both men have visited Israel before, Ricciarelli on vacations, and Fehling to make a movie called *Atomic Falafel*, directed by Dror Shaul (*Sweet Mud*), which has not been **released** yet.

Ricciarelli, who said he was now working on a modern day political drama, said he was very happy with the **reception** that *Labyrinth of Lies* had gotten all over the world.

"It's very **addictive** to have a film that is really interesting to people, it's **rewarding**. *Der Spiegel* had four pages when the movie came out.

There was one line about how it's a great movie, and the rest was about the prosecutors and the trial... It's an **entertainment** business. You hope for meaning, but you don't always have it."

Incubus: “Sorry it’s been so long.”

Alternative rock band *Incubus* kicked off their first Israeli show since 2007 with an **apology** last Tuesday night in Ra’anana, “Sorry it’s been so long since we’ve come back here,” said tall, elegant front-man Brandon Boyd. “We will try not to stay gone for so long.” Last Tuesday night, the band **deserved** the even bigger **crowd**, and a much louder sound system than what were at their first **performance**, with Amphipark Ra’anana and its stage design looking a lot like the Statue of Liberty (פסל החירות) **crown** with the perfect warm welcome.

Boyd had an extra reason to **celebrate** the show: this performance is a part of their **official** return after falling off the radar for the past two years to write and record a new album, which was **released** this year.

Twenty years ago, *Incubus* released the album *Fungus Amongus*, and went on to release six more. Watching them perform hit after hit last week, mixing ballads with hardcore metal songs and **catchy** new tracks (which the crowd were only too happy to dance to), it’s clear that their wide **range** of genre **influences** have ended in a musical **epiphany**: *Incubus* is back, better than ever.

Heavy on flashbacks from the ‘90s and early ‘00s, watching them felt like jumping into a time capsule shooting you back to the very first moment you heard *Incubus*. Even Boyd, tattooed and shirtless, seemed like he hasn’t aged a day.

With the **strength** of the frontman’s songwriting and the band’s tight, lively performance, *Incubus* – lead guitarist Mike Einziger, Chris Kilmore on record player and **keyboards**, bassist Ben Kenney and unstoppable José Pasillas on **drums** – have an energy that’s **infectious**.

During the opening song, *Wish You Were Here*, Boyd was already stepping strongly across the stage. No matter that the song is 14 years old – it connected with the **audience**. The band mirrored the crowd’s excitement, and in the territory of live performance there is nothing sweeter.

They found the right **gear** on the second song, *Anna Molly*, with Boyd **warning** the ecstatic crowd, “It’s gonna be a hot night!” He wasn’t joking; the heat level was on – *A Kiss to Send Us Off, Are you In? Nice to Know You, Megalomaniac* (with Nirvana’s *Come as You Are* during the bridge) then finishing off with the fitting *Pardon me while I burst into flames* during *Pardon Me*.

Incubus tried out the songs from their new four-track EP, *Trust Fall (Side A)*, released back in May. Every one of them were well **received**, Boyd’s **impressive**, **ragged** vocal range **challenging** the new ambient sound, while Kenny and Einziger’s guitars worked together perfectly. Still, nothing was better than the classic **encore**, *Drive*, with the audience holding their chests and singing along.

The only bad thing was how often Boyd thanked the crowd with “muchos gracias” **instead** of “shalom.” It seems after their latest tour to Mexico for “Festival Cubre Tajín,” we’re not the only ones stuck in a time **loop**.

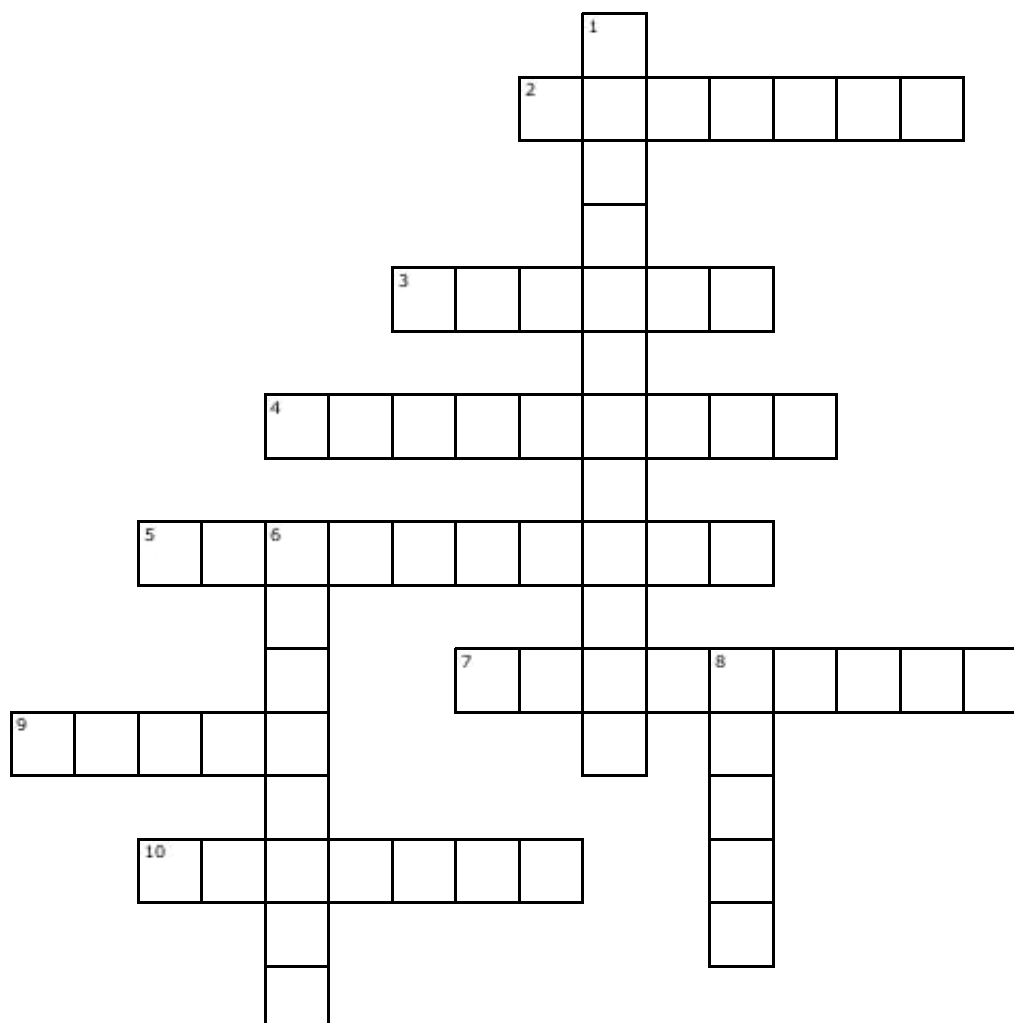

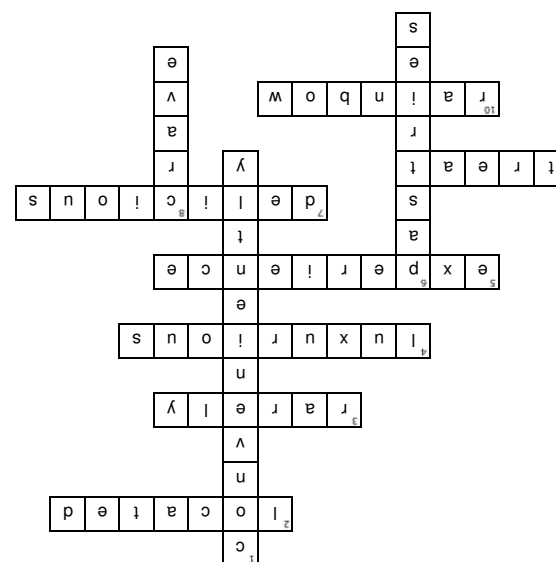

Two hard games await our national football team.

As part of Maccabi Tel Aviv and Hapoel Eilat's **semi-final** playoff series, the teams will play a **decisive** fifth and last game tonight. For the first time in the yellow-and-blue team's history, the team lost a 2-0 series **advantage**, and with their **roster** still missing important players because of **injuries**, Eilat will try and complete a three-game winning **streak**. This will bring the team to play against Hapoel Jerusalem for a historic team **championship title**.

The fourth game, played on Sunday, had Eilat not only controlling the **tempo** of the game, but also giving a great all-around **performance** from its Israeli players. Elishay Kadir, Afik Nissim and Amit Simchon scored 45 out of the 92 points the southern team collected in its 92-79 win.

Guy Goodes and Tel Aviv will try and win the home game tonight, in what could become one of Israel's basketball game classics.

The NBA Finals series between David Blatt's Cleveland Cavaliers and the Golden State Warriors is heading into its finals days.

Despite an amazing performance from LeBron James, the Cavs lost to the Warriors in the fifth game played at Oakland, 104-91, and are now just one game away from losing the finals series.

For Golden State, it was Stephen Curry who, by scoring 17 of his 37 points in the fourth and final **quarter**, gave his Warriors a win, and a real chance of a first NBA title since 1975.

Israel's **national** football team played an important match away against Bosnia, and lost their game, 1-3. Despite being the first to score, with a surprising goal from Tal Ben-Haim after 40 minutes, it took the Bosnian team only five minutes to **overturn** the score, and the end of the first half had the Bosnians ahead, 1-2.

Israel tried to get a **tying** goal, but it was Bosnia who got an extra goal to **seal** their **victory**.

With their loss, Israel is in the third place in their group at the moment, behind Belgium and Wales, but in front of Bosnia and Cyprus. With four more games to be played, **including** two very **tough** matches away in Belgium and Wales, the blue-and-whites hope to stay in the third place, a position which will let them play in the European Championship playoff games.

MEET HELLBOY

A new horned dinosaur.

Scientists had a hard time getting the **fossil** of a dinosaur they named “Hellboy” out of the **limestone** along a Canadian river **bank**, where it was **buried** for 68 million years. But their work was **worth** it. The scientists **described** one of the most special **horned** dinosaurs ever found, an animal with a strange set of horns on its face.

“This new animal is surely one of the weirdest horned dinosaurs,” said paleontologist Caleb Brown of the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology in Alberta. “How weird it really is only becomes fully clear when you **compare** it to its close **relatives**, in which case it stands out as very different from them.” They **officially** named it *Regaliceratops peterhewsi*, meaning “royal horned face” and after geologist Peter Hews, who found it.

But they gave it the **nickname** “Hellboy” because its short horns above the eyes look like the comic-book **character** of the same name, and also because of the hellish time they had in getting it out of what they called “**evil** hard rock.”

“We did have an earlier, politically-incorrect name for it, but with great **effort** we were able to stop ourselves from using it after a few months,” paleontologist Donald Henderson said. *Regaliceratops*, which was not much larger from today’s largest **rhinos**, was believed to be at 5 meters long, 1.5 meters tall at the **hips**, and about 1.5 tons heavy.

“Think of it as a big SUV,” Brown said.

Unlike being **squashed flat** like many fossils, the **skull** was saved in an amazing three-**dimensional** state. Horned dinosaurs were a scary group of Cretaceous Period **plant**-eaters. *Regaliceratops* lived near the end of the time of dinosaurs.

It had a large **cone**-shaped horn over its nose and a pair of small, turning-front horns over its eyes that were very small compared to its bigger close relative, *Triceratops*. Seven bony points in triangular (משולש) and pentagonal (מחומש) shapes formed a **halo** around its head.

“It looks like a **crown** around the face of the animal,” Brown said.

Almost the whole skull, but none of the rest of the body, has been found.
